In 2022, Agrisud celebrated its 30 years of action in the service of the same ambition "Fighting poverty through entrepreneurship".

The method used, which has been refined over the years, consists in:

- supporting family farms in a professionalization process to change them into successful very small farming enterprises (VSEs),
- disseminating agroecological practices to secure and intensify production in a context of climate change, while preserving natural resources and biodiversity,
- incorporating these actions into territorial development strategies.

This anniversary was an opportunity to share with the teams, partners, and stakeholders in the field, the fundamentals of our actions, which include entrepreneurship to fight poverty, at the origin of the creation of Agrisud by **Jacques Baratier**, but also agroecology as a virtuous agricultural model structured under the presidency of **Robert Lion**.

It was also an opportunity to share the results of all these years. In Morocco, Madagascar, Cambodia, or Senegal, nearly 100 people gathered at different dedicated events to attend results presentations and to advocate for sustainable agricultural development.

In Ivory Coast, we can highlight the presence of Agrisud at the 15th Conference of the Parties (COP15) of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification in Abidjan last May where we moderated discussions on "agroecology as a solution to land degradation".

You can read more about these events on page 28 of the report.

What can we learn from these results?

On the plus side, we can be proud to have supported and strengthened **85,567 VSEs** in nearly **30 countries**. Most of them are now mature. This has lifted some **427,835 people out of poverty** and, finally, allowed them to live out of their land and on their land. Those concrete and visible results in the field are illustrated by the testimonies in this report.


Sadly, on the down side, we have to admit that the debates on agriculture from a climate, biodiversity or food security point of view have not progressed much in the past 10 years at the international level.


The Covid-19 crisis has highlighted the huge gaps in the dominant agricultural model, largely based on cash or export crops and having moved away from local food farming. This agriculture is often unable to meet the daily needs of the populations of the Southern countries: a paradox for these predominantly agricultural countries!

This encourages us, based on our experience, to amplify our actions. As of 2022, our activity volume increased by more than 10%:

- We have launched larger new projects in consortium with other NGOs - including members of Groupe Initiatives - and research bodies.
- We have structured and digitalized the transfer of knowledge by putting online as part of our new website a media library and e-learning courses accessible to the widest possible audience.
- We have worked with our partners, AVSF, Cari and Gret on a new methodological guide – which will be published in February 2023 – to assess the different actual performances of agroecology and to improve field interventions.

More than ever, the experience gained by Agrisud over the past 30 years in building sustainable food systems seems useful and relevant to us. It is in this spirit that we approach 2023.


From September, 22nd to November, 7th Departmental Park of Chanteraines, Villeneuve-la-Garenne




Prior to the Covid-19 crisis. 60-70% of agricultural food consumed in the Seychelles came from imports. But strong disruptions in international trade since 2020 have underlined the fragility and risks of such a system.

Also, the government of the Seychelles has affirmed its short and medium-term strategy to increase local food production and consumption.

The project

Connecting the very small family farming enterprises of the Seychelles to tourism operators in the country as part of the incentive to sustainable purchases according to 3 key criteria:

- Local > by relocating supplies to reduce the ecological footprint,
- Social > by favoring small family farms to promote their development.
- Agroecology > to preserve natural resources and adapt to climate change.



"LFPA is very proud to have delivered 8 tons of products within six months in 2022! In all honesty, there was some skepticism about the ability of local producers to get organized and to seize this market opportunity. But together, we achieved this first step. Today, we are seeing a gradual adoption of agroecological practices, an increasing mobilization of producers and, above all, an improvement of our products value."

Enhancing agricultural areas, restoring, and protecting natural resources

EXAMPLE / Development of the Limbé watershed and of natural resources in the Nord Department of Haiti



The context

The *Limbé* watershed covers 31,000 ha. Cropping systems on slopes are subject to intense erosion due to heavy rains. The deterioration of these areas leads to a decrease in production, especially as most farming families do not have room for maneuver because of land pressure and the small size of farms. Added to this is the failure of successive governments to establish political stability, which leads the country – with an already fragile economy – to an even more alarming situation.


The project

Creating a conducive environment for agroecological transition to reconcile food security, income generation, protection and restoration of natural resources, and adaptation to climate change.

To this end, the project includes notably actions on planning, preservation and development of natural resources, and support to family farms.

Providing goods and create value: the double challenge of agro-processing

EXAMPLE / Creation of a processing facility to produce dried spices and infusions in the Municipality of Kandek in Cambodia

The context

With the Angkor temples, the Siem Reap Province hosts most of tourism in Cambodia. The tourist sector generates significant demand for agricultural products. But local supply is spread over in a large number of small family farms with very little processing capacity.

The development of processing activities is an opportunity to increase the added value of products and to help diversifying farm incomes.

The project

Creating and developing a processing facility for the production of spices and infusions from local products: turmeric, ginger, roselle, lemongrass, bael...

"We decided to go into agro-processing because it allows to conserve the products and it improves our income. But we needed techniques, equipment, and markets! With the project, we have been trained, and we were able to set up our processing facility. Today, we offer various products: turmeric, ginger but also infusions. Our goal is to increase product volumes while maintaining quality standards."

"The main challenge in setting up the processing facility was to produce regularly and to guarantee the sanitary quality of the products. There has been significant progress in terms of quality and the products perfectly meet the markets requirements. The development of this agro-processing activity, even on the artisanal scale, contributes greatly to improving the families incomes."



"The products from the processing facility are of good quality. I often buy them for my own consumption, especially turmeric powder. The Department of Trade strongly encourages the development of small-sized processing facilities as this is consistent with the policy of the Cambodian government and the Ministry of Trade. It is indeed important that local products gain more and more market share, including internationally!"

Initiating and implementing territorial projects supported by a variety of stakeholders

EXAMPLE / Implementation of an Agricultural Development Plan (ADP) in the village of Adattié, Abidjan Autonomous District in Ivory Coast



The context

Since 2021, Agrisud International has been running a pilot project in partnership with Abidjan Autonomous District.

It aims to strengthen the economic and social dynamics led by the stakeholders of the territory in favor of family food agriculture and the development of the *attiéké* sector, produced from local cassava. This project is implemented in three villages, including Adattié, in the Sub-Prefecture of Anyama.

The project

Supporting a multi-stakeholder village committee: traditional authorities, farming VSEs... to identify actions aimed at securing and enhancing local agriculture. To do so, a diagnosis based on participatory mapping has made it possible to sketch an ADP that details a development strategy for the village by 2030 around four major challenges: preserving agricultural land in the face of urbanization, training young people and women in agricultural and para-agricultural occupations, strengthening the viability of activities, promoting the heritage of the village.

"Our village benefited from the experience of the first Agricultural Development Plan. We appreciated the participatory method based on mapping, which made it possible for all the village communities to reflect together, including women and youth. We now know the boundaries of our territory, we have become aware of the land issues to preserve agriculture, and we have identified priority actions to be taken by 2030."

"The participatory workshops allowed villagers to become aware and to anticipate the problems related to the increasing urbanization in Abidjan Autonomous District. Agriculture is threatened while it is the main economic activity of Adattié, based on cash crops, food farming and agroprocessing of attiéké and palm oil. The actions mentioned in the ADP must be carried out now in order to preserve and enhance it."





The objective of the evaluation is both to improve support to farms in their agroecological transition and to produce references on the benefits of agroecology at socio-economic, climate and environmental levels.


